## **Riverbanks Roundup – NEW Program April 19 on ETV**

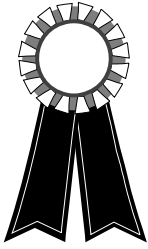
April 19, 6:30-7:00 p.m. ETV open circuit

In the wild, animals like Hyenas, King Cobras and Harris Hawks scavenge and hunt for their food. Learn how Riverbanks Zoo prepares the right kinds of meat to meet the animal’s needs...and then gives it to them!

Join host Katie Mixon and her special guests as they talk about the carnivores that are housed and cared for at the zoo and how they know and understand the special considerations that need to be made for meat eaters. Meat gives animals energy. Zookeepers can vary amount, types and ways meat is presented to the animals to support training and enrichment activities. Humans also need to eat a balanced diet, which could involve meat, to survive.

## ETV's Road Trip! Through SC Civil Rights History Provides New Program on the Upstate

April 8, 12:30–1:56 p.m. Channel 1

Repeats April 16, 8:00–9:26 a.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights)

Produced by ETV, these three programs focus on events, places and people who played an important role during the civil rights movement in our state from the 1940's through the early 1970's. The Civil Rights Movement has been part of an ongoing struggle since enslaved Africans were first brought to America. The modern Civil Rights Movement began in the 1940's with major events happening between 1953 and 1968.

The NEW program *Road Trip! Upstate* is part three in the series. Follow the Road Trip! crew as they travel the roads of northern South Carolina, visiting historic civil rights locations in the upstate. Visit the grounds of the old Friendship College in Rock Hill and Main Street in downtown Rock Hill where protesting college student labeled the "Friendship Nine" changed the strategy of the Civil Rights Movement nationally. The other two programs are already in *StreamlineSC*. *Road Trip! Mid State* includes the home of Modjesto Simkins and a visit to historic Liberty Hill AME Church. *Road Trip! Coastal* visits the Penn Center in Beaufort County and historic Atlantic Beach.

Also, check out **Road Trip! Through South Carolina Civil Rights History** online! It brings a fresh approach to teaching history to technologically aware children. Imagine sitting in your hi-tech hybrid vehicle outfitted with a GPS tracking system, a wireless laptop, a smart phone and a digital camcorder. Students use these virtual instruments to "travel" back in time to learn about historical events, places and people who played an important role during the civil rights movement in South Carolina from the 1940's through the early 1970's. # Colonial Williamsburg Electronic Field Trips Program on Life of Soldier April 23 and Plan for 2009-10!

**April 23, 2009** *Soldier of Liberty*

10:00–11:00 a.m. and 1:00–2:00 p.m. on channel 301 1:00–2:00 p.m. on ETV open circuit  
(Limited rights – record with 10-day fair use rights from original broadcast date. See below.)

In this electronic field trip from Colonial Williamsburg, students can experience the everyday life of a soldier during the American Revolution. Enlist in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Virginia Regiment with young recruit Nathaniel Hutcheson and march into battle with him as he encounters for the first time the noise, confusion and horror of war.

The CWEFT programs use 21st century technology to enrich the teaching of history and social studies. The field trips are correlated to national standards and provide a compelling learning experience for grades 4–8, using re-enactors to play historical figures. ITV offers one scholarship for each program. Congratulations to **Marcy Mickelson at Wilder Elementary** in Sumter School District 17 for receiving the April CWEFT scholarship!

**Now is the time to plan for the 2009–10 Colonial Williamsburg Electronic Field Trips!** Talk to your PTO about sponsoring the programs for next year. SC schools can receive all seven programs for around \$500. Though schools may view FREE and record programs with 10-day fair use rights (can tape and use for 10 days from broadcast date, but must erase tape within 45 days), there are advantages to paying the fee to Colonial Williamsburg to participate. By paying the fee, schools get the teacher materials, get to keep the recorded program for the life of the tape and have access to the re-enactors/historians online and via a toll-free number. Using the example of Jamestown in 1607, explore the myths and misconceptions of that era: revisit the documents, artifacts, and other evidence through archaeology. Learn how every generation sees the evidence in new ways, and how this affects our understanding of the past |
| Jan. 14, 2010 | <i>Westward!</i> (premiere) – Explore the story of the early days of American westward expansion. Daniel Boone recounts the exciting experiences and unexpected consequences associated with moving west. Learn about the risks and grueling personal hardships of creating new settlements.  |
| Feb. 11, 2010 | <i>The Slave Trade</i> – Beginning with the American Revolution, this program explores the U.S. law of 1807 that abolished the trans-Atlantic slave trade. Meet the people who were involved in or influenced by this pivotal legislation: the slaves, plantation owners, slave-ship captains, common seamen, government officials, Navy officers, and anti-slavery activists.                              |
| Mar. 11, 2010 | <i>The Rights of Youth</i> (premiere) – Imprisonment, whipping, forced transportation, and even death were some of the punishments that courts sentenced children to in the eighteenth century. Witness how justice was administered at a time when criminal laws and sentencing guidelines made few or no exceptions for children.   |
| Apr. 22, 2010 | <i>Treasure Keepers</i> – You have seen their work in every museum, but what do conservators really do? Learn how conservators prevent or slow the damage caused by “agents of destruction.” Explore how and why preserving history is important for future generations.  |

## Curriculum and Content Corner...highlighting National Library Week, Earth Day and test preparation... with Dianne L. Gregory

*National Library Week* and *School Library Media Month* are celebrated across our country to encourage people to read. Begun in the 1950's, the first promotional campaign theme was called *Wake Up and Read!* Celebrated to promote the use of all types of libraries, its foundation is to encourage reading. **A Literary Tour of South Carolina** series produced by **ITV** and **ETV** introduces students to nationally recognized authors who call South Carolina home. As they learn about the writing process, students will hear what the authors have to say about making characters come alive on the page, learn how to create the plot for their stories and keep track of the action, and find out how important research

is to any story, both fiction and non-fiction. Available through **ITV** and *StreamlineSC* this series is a wonderful means of introducing students to authors such as Dorothea Benton Frank, Idella Bodie, Mary Alice Monroe, Mignon Ballard, Tamar Myers, and many more. **Writers' Circle**, also available through **ITV** and *StreamlineSC*, features local writers discussing their personal style from idea to manuscript to finished work. **Inside Writing** highlights prominent authors who have visited our state. Each discusses how to get ideas for books and how the storyline and characters are developed. Used to inspire young readers and writers, Sarah Dessen, April Pulley Sayre, Ching Russell, Rosemary Wells, and Anna Myers are among the featured writers.

The Earth Day programming is suitable for elementary and middle school students. Not only are these programs available through **ITV**, they are also available through *StreamlineSC*. **Earth Day Specials** provide other environmental resources developed by DHEC and **ITV**. **Talking Trash**, grades 4–8, focuses on what can be recycled and made into other useful products. These three fifteen-minute lessons teach the value of recycling. **NatureScene SC** and **NatureScene USA** highlighting the explorations of Rudy Mancke through our magnificent earth parallel the focus of Earth Day. These programs are available "by special request through **ITV**." Rudy Mancke's **Nature Notes**, available through **ITV** and *StreamlineSC*, are educational capsules of effective lesson triggers that can be used in school news programming.

Let **ITV** assist you in preparing your students for testing! It's time to review study skills and test taking hints with our students. **Becoming Successful in Middle School** features two twenty minute lessons on *Developing Good Study Skills*. This valuable series is a must for upper elementary through middle school. In our *StreamlineSC* resources, there is a variety of programming available to reinforce these skills. **Testwise: The Smart Way to Prepare For and Take Tests** stresses preparation and techniques for reviewing material as well as strategies for improving scores. **Seven Steps to Good Study Habits (Part I and II)** emphasizes the importance of a positive attitude towards schoolwork. **Study Skills I and II (A Sunburst Title)** emphasizes the need for personal responsibility and helps students acquire the skills that improve learning which includes organizing, managing time, listening for meaning, note-taking, and studying for tests. Special programming to address safe choices by teens to help inform them about the choices they make in driving recklessly and in other unsafe behaviors such as drinking, gang activities, using drugs, and eating disorders repeats this month. Please let your high school guidance counselors know about these programs that could be valuable for students as they head into prom and graduation celebrations.

- **Street Skills** - four 26-minute programs, which use contemporary music, fast edits, and MTV-style videography to get to the mechanics, physics and psychology of driving. Repeats April 7, 9:00–10:57 a.m. on channel 2. (Unlimited broadcast/off-air record use, but no tape duplication)
- **Think Twice** – one 22-minute lesson, which was produced by ETV with DJJ. Three teens who found themselves behind bars talk to fellow teens about the choices they made and what they would have done differently. Repeats April 7, 11:00–11:23 a.m., on channel 2. (Unlimited rights)
- **Private Victories** – four 29-minute programs, which present the message of caring enough about yourself to resist drugs by following the lives of several teenage students to see what effect drug use had on them and the people who cared about them. Repeats April 7, 11:30 a.m.–1:26 p.m., on channel 2. (Unlimited rights)
- **Grave Decisions** – one 55-minute program produced by ETV in partnership with the SC Department of Public Safety and the SC Commission on Prosecution Coordination. This provocative program explores three separate cases in the state where teenagers were drinking and driving. Aired for the first time on ETV in April 2001. Please preview before use with students. (Program 2 in the ITV **Teen Survival Programs** series.) Repeats April 8, 9:00–9:55 a.m., on channel 2. (Unlimited rights)
- **Keep It Real** – one 25-minute program produced by ETV in cooperation with Project READY (Realistic Education About Dying Young). It educates teens on the harsh realities of risk-taking behavior such as not wearing seatbelts, violence, drug abuse, speeding, and drinking and driving by following teens through Project READY at a level one trauma center. Not intended for audiences under 14. (Program 1 in the ITV **Teen Survival Programs** series.) Repeats April 8, 10:00–10:25 a.m., on channel 2. (Unlimited rights)
- **MCTFT: Kids, Drugs, Crime, and Consequences** – one program with three parts that can be used with grades 4–8 also. Aired for the first time in April 2005. (Program 4 in the ITV **Teen Survival Programs** series.) Repeats April 8, 10:30–11:00 a.m., on channel 2. (Unlimited rights)
- **Gangs: It's Your Life** – three 22–28 minute programs provided in the ITV schedule and in *StreamlineSC*. Through narration, interviews and taped segments, these programs examine why youths join gangs and the unfortunate consequences of gang life. Repeats April 8, 11:05 a.m.–12:30 p.m., on channel 2. ### **Module 1 - KITE-LL Methodology and Community Outreach**

Helps language teachers new to the KITE-LL program understand the non-negotiables of the KITE-LL program: instruction in the target language only, curriculum based on grade-level standards as well as authentic materials from the target culture and performance assessments at the end of each unit. In addition, KITE-LL teachers get ideas on how to sustain the language program through community outreach.

### **Module 2 - A Week in the Life of a KITE-LL Teacher**

Provides an orientation for language teachers who are new to the KITE-LL program, taking them through each day of a typical week of instruction. Teachers learn what, when, and how to present each lesson and how to work with the classroom teachers in their schools who are responsible for the monitoring students during the taped lessons.

Guides language teachers who are new to the KITE-LL program through the secure Blackboard site that houses all of the KITE-LL materials. Teachers learn how to use the Instructor's Guide, access copy masters and interact with others using program in SC.

### **Module 5 - How Classroom Teachers Contribute to KITE-LL's Success**

Outlines the responsibilities of classroom teachers who are new to the KITE-LL program. The focus is on how the classroom teacher works with the KITE-LL language teacher in order to ensure student success in the language program.

### **Module 6 - How Principals Ensure KITE-LL's Success**

Outlines the responsibilities of instructional leaders to principals who are new to the KITE-LL program. The focus is on the conditions necessary for the successful implementation of the KITE-LL program.

### **Course begins Online June 15!**

A new ITV recertification course entitled *A Gendered Classroom*, developed by instructor David Chadwell and produced as a cooperative effort between the SC Department of Education's Office, ITV and ETV, provides key information about single-gender education, focusing on six differences between boys and girls, the implications in the classroom, and strategies to meet the needs of individual students. Interviews with teachers from single-gender classes are also a part of the videos. Single-gender education is teaching boys and girls the same high standards within different classrooms. Federal regulations issued in October 2006 authorized the use of single-gender classrooms, programs, and schools within districts as a way to meet the educational needs of its students. Currently, there are over 200 schools within South Carolina that offer some form of single-gender program. Single-gender programs exist in elementary, middle and high schools.

All class meetings will take place through distance learning. The instructor and participants will communicate via Blackboard—the course platform on the Internet. The course manager will set up your account in Blackboard. You must have a valid e-mail address to enable us to set up your account. Assignments and discussion forums will be facilitated in Blackboard and participation will be monitored/evaluated.

#### **ITV recertification courses are open to educators with a SC teaching certificate.**

ITV provides Office of Educator Certification approved recertification courses. All courses are professional development courses only and may be used for certificate renewal credit. These courses cannot be used to satisfy undergraduate or graduate degree program requirements.

It is the **educator's responsibility** to contact a district professional development coordinator and/or an Office of Educator Certification analyst **prior to registration** to determine if ITV offerings will meet professional development plan and/or certificate renewal requirements.
