Finding Money for College 2009 Repeats on ETV & ITV Updated Information on Ways to Access \$ for School

Repeats Jan. 29 and Feb. 2 and 9, 10:30 a.m.–12:30 p.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights)

A special two-hour program to assist students and parents in looking for ways to pay for a college education aired January 25, 5:00–7:00 p.m. Many high schools tape this program to have it on hand in the guidance office. The repeat broadcasts are NOT interactive with call-in questions, but the information is still useful to students and parents trying to find money for higher education.

Finding Money for College features financial aid professionals from public/private colleges and universities in South Carolina, including a technical college. In addition, guidance counselors offer advice and representatives from the South Carolina Higher Education Tuition Grants Commission, South Carolina Student Loan Corporation and South Carolina Commission on Higher Education answer questions on accessing scholarships, grants and loans.

In addition to providing key information, this year's program features a special segment on high school guidance services to help students find financial help for college that was taped at **Dutch Fork High School** in Lexington School District Five. These students from Dutch Fork also give their peers advice about what can help them in the process. Congratulations to the Silver Foxes for being selected as our feature school this year on **Finding Money for College**! This information is very timely and especially needed for seniors, but valuable for juniors to plan ahead. Please tape this NEW program for your high school guidance counselors if you did not tape it in January. - 4) All submissions **must be postmarked by April 6, 2009** deadline.

NEW Lessons in Idella Bodie's SC Women Series – Tape Ahead for Women's History Month!

New lessons: **Mary McLeod Bethune & Wil Lou Gray** Feb. 12, 10:12–11:36 a.m. Channel 1

Repeats Feb. 20, 8:00–9:23 a.m. Channel 1

Special block feed of ALL six lessons in series Feb. 12, 8:00–11:36 a.m. Channel 1

(ALL with unlimited rights) The teacher's guide has been updated to include new lessons!

Produced by ITV and ETV and directed by ETV's Pat Henry, the stories in this NEW series are being adapted with permission and input from author Idella Bodie. They are dramatizations of the stories from her book *South Carolina Women*. Recommended to support social studies standards for South Carolina history for elementary and middle grade students, the programs are also good for use during Women's History Month with students in grades 3–12. **Idella Bodie's SC Women** series features stories about heroines in our state's history. Each dramatization tells the story of women who have shaped South Carolina history and politics. These two additional lessons on **Wil Lou Gray** and **Mary McLeod Bethune** join programs on **Grace and Rachel Martin, Emily Geiger, Mary Chesnut, and The Grimké Sisters**. The two new dramas show the courage that each woman displayed to help others better themselves. This series has been produced at historical sites and homes. Be sure to access the accompanying teacher's guide, which is updated with all new lessons.

Program Five (NEW) – Wil Lou Gray

Tells the story of Dr. Wil Lou Gray who began the South Carolina Opportunity School. The program follows her from the time that she was a young girl struggling with the loss of her dear mother through Dr. Gray's valiant efforts to get the Legislature to fund schooling for illiterate adults and children. Through reenactment of scenes in her life and interviews taped with Dr. Gray by ETV in the 1980's, we hear in Dr. Gray's own words her passion to help others to learn while we learn about what life was like during the early 1900's for many South Carolinians.

Program Six (NEW) – Mary McLeod Bethune

This is the story of one woman's struggle to gain equality for herself and her students. The drama begins with Mary as a young child growing up in Mayesville, South Carolina, and concludes with her hard work to start a school for African American students in Florida. Through the scenes we see the struggle that Mary encountered just to be given the chance to learn to read and then to teach others, including being threatened with bodily harm. The drama shows how she started with nothing and ended up being an advisor to a United States President!

Other Programs in the Series:

Program One - Grace and Rachel Martin

This is the story of two sisters-in-law living alone in the South Carolina back country who waylaid a British Courier with valuable papers by dressing up as colonial men. They risked their lives to stop the flow of information. Taped on location with historical costumes and artifacts, it takes place in the cabin considered to be the oldest frontier house still standing in SC.

Program Two – Emily Geiger

Emily is a young girl who risked her life by serving as a messenger for the Colonial army during the Revolutionary War. Captured by the British and interrogated as a spy, she managed to trick Lord Rawdon into believing she was innocent, outwitting her captors in a most unique manner. Taped in part at the actual location where the interrogation took place, this drama covers the story of Emily's journey from her assignment with General Greene to her release by Lord Rawdon.

Program Three - Mary Chesnut

Mary kept a diary during the turbulent times of the Civil War. This drama portrays various events in the life of the South Carolina heroine prior to and during the Civil War. The events dramatized are actual happenings that occurred to Mary and most of the words come straight from her diary. Mary actually spent time at Kensington Plantation, the location of the drama.

Program Four - The Grimké Sisters

Sarah Moore Grimké (1792-1873) and Angelina Emily Grimké (1805-1879), followed a similar path, speaking out about what they believed and leaving their home to join the fight for the causes of the abolition of slavery and equal rights for women. Today women are leaders in the community and in the business world, working along side their male counterparts in voicing and making their decisions, but it was not the same in the 1800's. These two South Carolina sisters helped lead the way to change the course of history in both our state and in the United States. We see from a young age how both stood up for what they believed were the wrongs of society. They spoke out against slavery and found the courage to fight for their right as women to have a voice.

“Quest of African Americans For Full Citizenship in America” is the title of **The Black History Teleconference XXII** presented by Benedict College on February 18 under the leadership of Dr. Marianna White Davis. The special features six high school students and one Benedict College student who direct questions to seven prominent African American about their ideas, challenges and achievements in relation to the national theme from the Association for the Study of African-American Life and History in Washington, DC. The presentation will be taped and then air on ETV February 22 and in the ITV schedule as announced above.

Dr. David H. Swinton, President of Benedict College, introduces the program and Dr. William “Sonny” Walker of Atlanta, GA serves as moderator. Dr. James L. Hill of Albany State University is the explicator of the topic. Guest panelists are: Dr. Hardin Coleman, Dean of the School of Education at Boston University; Roderick Dixon, internationally known tenor from Chicago; Rebecca C. Jackson, President of several companies in Philadelphia; attorney Peggy McFadden-Elmore, Deputy Director of Operations at the Federal Office of Medicare Hearings and Appeals, Washington, DC; Leslie Jones Patterson, partner at Ernst, Young, LLP in Atlanta, GA; Aubyne E. Thomas, Senior Vice President of Corporate Marketing at Macy's, Inc., New York City; attorney Melford W. Walker, Jr., Vice President and Assistant General Counsel, Wachovia Corp. in Charlotte, NC.

High School students participating are from A.C. Flora, Hunter-Kinard-Tyler, Lower Richland, Richland Northeast, Spring Valley, and W.J. Keenan High Schools.

MonarchLIVE Series from PWN (Prince William Network)

This NEW series of teleconferences follows the magical migration of monarchs. Designed for grades 4–8, the six programs provide a visit with Mexican and American biologists who study the monarch's winter habitat. Every year millions of monarchs migrate thousands of miles from Canada and the United States to over winter in the mountain peaks in Mexico. The magical journey is dependent on conservation of habitats in three North American countries – United State, Canada and Mexico.

The first program, **MonarchLIVE - Kickoff**, aired October 10, 2008. ITV will repeat this first program prior to the broadcast of the NEW programs on February 17 and 19. Both February programs will be provided in English during the first time slot starting at noon and then in Spanish during the 2:00 hour. See schedule below. (**NOTE:** The Kickoff program will only be provided in English.)

MonarchLIVE – In the Mexican Mountains

Feb. 17, 12:00 noon–1:00 p.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited rights)

Feb. 17, 2:00-3:00 p.m. **Spanish ONLY** Channel 2 (Unlimited rights)

In this second program, the biology of over wintering monarchs in the oyamel forests, finding and reporting tagged monarchs and conservation work in Mexico will be discussed.

MonarchLIVE – Community Conservation in Mexico

Feb. 19, 12:00 noon–1:00 p.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited rights)

Feb. 19, 2:00-3:00 p.m. **Spanish ONLY** Channel 2 (Unlimited rights)

The third program shows how the community where the monarchs over winter are involved in monitoring and conservation work. Wintering behavior, resting, avoiding predators, and reserving lipids for northward migration will be reviewed.

Presidents' Day...The birthdays of George Washington, February 22, and Abraham Lincoln, February 12, are the basis of honoring all U.S. Presidents on the third Monday in February. **ITV** provides a variety of programming to enhance the classroom. **Project Discovery Revisited** has 5 programs of interest to all ages: **Colonial Williamsburg Field Trip Part 1 and Part 2; Mr. Jefferson's Monticello Part 1 and Part 2** and **George**

Washington's Mount Vernon are available through **ITV** and **StreamlineSC**. Also provided in both viewing venues are **American Heroes and Heroines, America At Its Best** and **The Living History Series**. Take a look at **George Washington**, for all age groups. Lesson titles include: *The Life of George Washington, Mount Vernon: Home of George Washington* and *Project Discovery Visits Mount Vernon*. African-American History Month has its established roots in the 1920's by the African-American scholar who founded the Association for the Study of African-American Life and History, Carter G. Woodson. February was chosen because Frederick Douglass and Abraham Lincoln were born in this month. This commemoration is an opportunity to emphasize the history and achievement of African-Americans.

Summoning the Dream: Pillars Against Prejudice, produced by ITV/ETV in conjunction with the South Carolina Bar Association, features three prominent South Carolina judges. Moderated by I. S. Both of these programs with teacher guides and SC standards correlations are available through **ITV** and **StreamlineSC**. **Road Trip! Through SC Civil Rights History** series, available through **knowitall.org** and **StreamlineSC**, focuses on events, places and people who have played an important role during the Civil Rights Movement in SC from the 1940's through the 1970's.

Choice, hope and escape from slavery are highlighted in stories spanning three centuries. Examine the options for slaves who were willing to risk their lives for freedom in this NEW program entitled *Freedom Bound* that airs February 19 at both 10:00 a.m. (channel 1) and 1:00 p.m. (channel 1 and ETV open circuit.) See more description and schedule below.

The CWEFT programs use 21st century technology to enrich the teaching of history and social studies, making the subjects exciting and relevant to today's classrooms. The field trips are correlated to national standards and provide a dramatic and compelling learning experience for 4th and 5th grade students. Though schools may view the programs free and record them with 10-day fair use rights (can tape and use for 10 days from broadcast date, but must erase tape within 45 days), there are definite advantages to paying the fee to Colonial Williamsburg to participate.

By paying the fee to participate, schools get the outstanding teacher materials, get to keep the recorded program for the life of the tape and have access to the re-enactors and historians online and via a toll-free number. Schools pay approximately \$500 per school for all seven programs, but rights for individual programs can be purchased. ONLY schools that receive a scholarship through ITV for one program OR schools that pay Colonial Williamsburg to participate either in single lessons or in the entire series can keep the copy of the program(s) for the life of the tape, receive the guides, get online access, and have phone interaction with the historians.

Modjeska Monteith Simkins (1899–1992) was one of South Carolina's great women. This program paints an interesting profile of the civil rights matriarch and human rights activist who believed that the best way to make change was to vote so she made sure people knew about their voting rights and participated in elections.

- **Carolina Stories – A True Likeness (Richard Samuel Roberts)**
Repeats Feb. 4, 10:03–10:29 a.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited rights)

This documentary tells the story of a little-known African American photographer from South Carolina whose posthumous discovery transcended stereotypes and brought to light a significant legacy. Richard Samuel Smalls is heralded as one of the south's most accomplished photographers of the 1920's and 30's.

- **Carolina Stories – The Penn Center: A Legacy of Change**

Designed for grades 6-9, this program originates from Fort Davis, Texas, which was a key post in the defense system of western Texas and southeastern New Mexico and was home to both black infantry and cavalry troops. African Americans served in the military since colonial times, but it wasn't until 1866 that black men could enlist in the Regular Peacetime Army. Native Americans called these men "Buffalo Soldiers" because their hair resembled the matted cushion that is between the horns of the buffalo. This term became a proudly worn "badge of honor," which signified courage and patriotism.

Embed a Video in PowerPoint

When you embed a downloaded file, you insert it right into your document much as you would a picture or clip art file. Embedding is an effective way to add video content to existing presentations, create interactive learning projects with menus and text prompts, or develop slide shows in which video files play automatically.

The procedure involved in embedding video files will vary with certain software applications. The following steps apply to documents created in Microsoft PowerPoint:

1. Download a video segment to a designated folder.
2. Save your new or revised PowerPoint document in the same folder.
3. Go to "Insert" > "Movies and Sounds" > "Movie from File."
4. Click to select the video file that you wish to insert in your document.

NOTE: With some software versions, you may have to "Browse for File" and navigate to your saved file.

5. Select the automatic play option or choose to start the video with a mouse click.

It's a new day, new year and new time. Many of you have been asking about types of storage medium you can use to store content available for download from *StreamLineSC*. We have spoken with a number of experts and they all agree that DVD is a viable storage medium to use for storing content too instead of VHS. In fact, just heard that manufacturing of VHS tapes are being phased out. All rules still apply as they relate to copyright issues etc. What it boils down to is if you could record it to a VHS, you can substitute a DVD. But, remember the rights issues! If you can't duplicate a tape; same with DVD. And, just because it is on a digital format does not mean you can load it onto your computer. Digital rights are required to ingest and deliver that way. Additionally, we are getting questions from those with IP delivery systems in place on whether or not cable channels can be re-broadcasted via IP delivery systems throughout the school building and district. The *Cable in the Classroom* rules are somewhat gray and the language can be interpreted in different ways. We are talking with a number of experts to interpret these rules. We will keep you posted. 
