Carolina Stories *Pirates of the Carolinas*...Special Repeat

Repeats Jan. 15, 8:30–9:30 a.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights) SL

Highlighting many interesting and varied aspects of our state and its history, the **Carolina Stories** series is produced by ETV. This special edition, entitled *Pirates of the Carolinas*, aired initially on ETV November 21, 2007. It can be a good resource to use when studying South Carolina history.

The program uncovers the adventures of the pirates who terrorized the South and North Carolina coasts including Blackbeard, Stede Bonnet, Charles Vane, Edward Low, and “Calico” Jack Rackham who marauded along the coastline during the Golden Age of Piracy from roughly 1690 to 1720.

The men were not alone! Mary Read, Ann Mills and Charleston’s Anne Bonny, all female pirates, went after their share of the loot. The program also digs into pirate myths, including the mystery of the silver goblet rumored to be made from Blackbeard’s skull. Please remind teachers to preview before use.

Colonial Williamsburg Electronic Field Trip – January 15th

The CWEFT programs use 21st century technology to enrich the teaching of history and social studies, making the subjects exciting and relevant to today’s classrooms. The field trips are correlated to national standards and provide a dramatic and compelling learning experience for 4th and 5th grade students. Though schools may view the programs free and record them with 10-day fair use rights (can tape and use for 10 days from broadcast date, but must erase tape within 45 days), there are definite advantages to paying the fee to Colonial Williamsburg to participate.

By paying the fee to participate, schools get the outstanding teacher materials, get to keep the recorded program for the life of the tape and have access to the re-enactors and historians online and via a toll-free number. Schools pay approximately \$500 per school for all seven programs, but rights for individual programs can be purchased. RIGHTS REMINDER: SC schools may view the programs with 10-day fair use rights. (Can record, but lesson must be used within ten days and then tape erased or destroyed within 45 days.) ONLY schools that receive a scholarship through ITV for one program OR schools that pay Colonial Williamsburg to participate either in single lessons or in the entire series can keep the copy of the program(s) for the life of the tape, receive the guides, get online access, and have phone interaction with the historians.

Designed for Grades 6–10, this current events series on news from around the world is hosted by teens and provides information to kids in an educational and entertaining manner. The teen news anchor team is a diverse group of young people, including some "celeb" kids, who relate the news and discuss key topics that impact teens in their own words. Short word segments build vocabulary and "WORK-IT" career segments help teens learn about many careers. Produced in partnership with *Weekly Reader Magazine*, this series is used by many TV stations across the country because it is unique, using actual kids reporting to other kids on television.

The Stock Market Simulation – Programs Start Jan. 23

The Underground Railroad – Two Excellent Programs

* **Northward to Freedom**

Repeats Jan. 21 and Feb. 4, 8:00–8:10 a.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights) SL

Designed for grades 4–10, this new docudrama highlights New York branches of the Underground Railroad through moving narratives and reenactments. Spotlighting the lesser-known routes that led through the Hudson and Champlain Valleys, it celebrates the courage and fortitude of slaves who risked capture and death to escape as well as those sympathetic who assisted them.

* **The Underground Railroad: Escape from Slavery**

Repeats Jan. 21 and Feb. 4, 8:15–8:40 a.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights) SL

This new program examines the institution of slavery from the capture to life on Southern plantations. The road to freedom through the network of people who offered food, safety and shelter is highlighted, addressing the impact of major milestones in history on slavery.

Becoming Americans – Historical Perspective on Slavery

Repeats Jan. 21 and Feb. 4, 8:45–10:55 a.m. Channel 1
(Unlimited broadcast/off-air record, but no duplication)

Two programs in the **Becoming Americans** series joined the ITV schedule in 2004. Produced by Colonial Williamsburg and recommended for grades 4–8, these lessons explore the origins and development of slavery from a historical perspective. *Enslaved, Part 1* and *Enslaved, Part 2* trace the legal progression of slavery in the American Colonies.

February One: The Greensboro Four, a documentary that tells the story of The Greensboro Four, was added to the ITV schedule January 2004 and is now available in *StreamlineSC*. Featuring dramatic reenactments, rare historical footage and first hand accounts of the event, **February One: The Greensboro Four** documents one volatile winter in Greensboro. The events not only challenged public accommodation customs and laws in North Carolina, but served as a blue print for the wave of non-violent civil rights protests that swept the South and the nation in the 1960’s. This program is excellent, presenting the history in a format that invites and keeps interest.

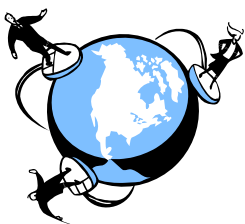

- Need to fill some time before lunch or during Rainy Day Recess? Keep a list of air times for ITV programs that meet your grade level standards handy. Then when you have a few minutes to fill, just click on the appropriate live feed from OnePlaceSC.

A two hour recertification course entitled **SC² South Carolina - Self Control** developed by Dr. Sue Smith-Rex and produced in cooperation with the State Department of Education's Guidance Services, is designed for elementary teachers, school counselors and administrators. This two-hour recertification course requires a learning team of elementary teachers, a school counselor and selected administrator. The school counselor is a key participant in the learning team. The seven programs were produced by ITV with ETV to provide SC schools with an effective way to meet the requirements of the Safe School Climate Act. The SC² model consists of three levels: Empathy (a group lesson for entire class), Mediation (training for student leaders) and Self Monitoring - Self Control (one-on-one folder system for selected students needing more intensive feedback). These levels are outlined in the seven video programs and online packet that guides educators on how to facilitate the model. The Model shows Dr. Sue Smith-Rex working with students in the role of the teacher and guidance counselor in all three levels while utilizing the packet of materials. SC² *South Carolina - Self Control* is a series designed as a certificate renewal course for two hours recertification credit -- no graduate credit offered. Dr. Sue Smith-Rex, educator and author, developed the content and serves as instructor. The model was piloted at Geiger Elementary School and they provide feedback/results.
