Carolina First Palmetto's Finest 2009

March 10, 9:00–10:00 a.m. Channel 2

Four South Carolina schools will be selected for the Carolina First Palmetto's Finest Awards in a special ceremony in Columbia on March 9th. This prestigious award is celebrating its 31st anniversary of recognizing schools that offer the best in innovative, effective educational programs. ETV will tape the awards celebration to showcase schools receiving Palmetto's Finest Awards for 2009 and it will then air in the ITV schedule. Plan to access it this program!

Statewide Virtual Faculty Meeting with Jim Rex Repeats

Repeats March 9, 9:30–10:30 a.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights)

The February 2 Statewide Virtual Faculty Meeting with our State Superintendent of Education will be repeated this month. Thousands of educators took part in this first-of-its kind virtual faculty meeting that was produced by ITV and ETV and provided by broadcast and streaming video. This meeting allowed Dr. Rex to share his perspectives on a variety of issues and gave educators a method to directly communicate their concerns to him.

During the first portion of the meeting, Dr. Rex discussed the state budget crisis, funding reform and the need to elevate the teaching profession. The last 45 minutes of the program were devoted to answering a variety of questions submitted via e-mail on topics ranging from teacher raises, school choice and the impact of the federal stimulus package, to transportation, consolidating services and student testing.

"I thank all the educators from across the state who extended their school day to join us for this meeting," Rex said. "We could not have been more pleased with the level of participation, the comments and questions. Based on feedback we've received, it's highly likely that we will use this approach to address a variety of issues in the future."

Department of Education officials say that the number of participating teachers probably reached into the tens of thousands because many watched at their schools in groups. The program has been archived in *StreamlineSC* (search for "Virtual Faculty Meeting") and in Educator+ (access from knowitall.org or from the ITV Web site at www.itv.myetv.org - small bullet in middle of home page by "Instant Replay").

ETV is looking into reports of problems from participants who tried to access via streaming. (See Web Talk article on page 17 in this *ITV Update*.) When another virtual faculty meeting is announced, we will provide updated information to assist you in access.

Viewers were invited to e-mail questions during the program.

ETV's Carolina Stories – NEW Program on Shrimping in SC

Carolina Stories – *Carolina Caught*

March 10, 1:00–1:27 p.m. Channel 1

Repeats March 18, 1:00–1:27 p.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights)

Shrimp is America's most valuable and probably most popular seafood. This special, narrated by naturalist Rudy Mancke, examines the challenges of South Carolina's shrimping industry, which is made up mainly of family-run businesses. Viewers follow Errol Hattaway, one of the few remaining shrimp boat fishermen in McClellanville, S.C., and shrimper Steve Kerchner of Beaufort, S.C. as they struggle to continue the tradition of fishing for shrimp off the coast of South Carolina. Higher fuel costs, lower prices for shrimp, and the changing uses of waterfront property are forcing shrimp boat fishermen to change their tactics or get out of the industry all together.

Carolina Caught is the first **Carolina Stories** to be produced and broadcast in High Definition. It was produced, written, directed & edited by Mark Adams. Videographers Mark Adams and Arthur Joseph spent the summer of 2008 filming in Beaufort, Charleston & McClellanville, S.C. to capture what is happening now in the shrimping industry. They also traveled to the Waddell Mariculture Center in Bluffton, S.C. to see their prototype for the next generation of pond-raised shrimp.

NEW Lessons in Idella Bodie's SC Women Series – Great for Women's History Month!

New lessons: **Mary McLeod Bethune & Wil Lou Gray** March 13, 8:00–9:25 a.m. Channel 1

Repeat block feed of ALL six lessons in series March 5, 8:00–11:36 a.m. Channel 1

(ALL with unlimited rights) The teacher's guide has been updated to include new lessons!

Produced by ITV and ETV and directed by ETV's Pat Henry, the stories in this NEW series are being adapted with permission and input from author Idella Bodie. They are dramatizations of the stories from her book *South Carolina Women*. Recommended to support social studies standards for South Carolina history for elementary and middle grade students, the programs are also good for use during Women's History Month with students in grades 3–12. **Idella Bodie's SC Women** series features stories about heroines in our state's history. Each dramatization tells the story of women who have shaped South Carolina history and politics. These two additional lessons on **Wil Lou Gray** and **Mary McLeod Bethune** join programs on **Grace and Rachel Martin, Emily Geiger, Mary Chesnut, and The Grimké Sisters**. The two new dramas show the courage that each woman displayed to help others better themselves. This series has been produced at historical sites and homes.

***Be sure to access the accompanying teacher's guide, which is updated with all new lessons.**

Program Five (NEW) – Wil Lou Gray

Tells the story of Dr. Wil Lou Gray who began the South Carolina Opportunity School. The program follows her from the time that she was a young girl struggling with the loss of her dear mother through Dr. Gray's valiant efforts to get the Legislature to fund schooling for illiterate adults and children. Through reenactment of scenes in her life and interviews taped with Dr. Gray by ETV in the 1980's, we hear in Dr. Gray's own words her passion to help others to learn while we learn about what life was like during the early 1900's for many South Carolinians.

Program Six (NEW) – Mary McLeod Bethune

This is the story of one woman's struggle to gain equality for herself and her students. The drama begins with Mary as a young child growing up in Mayesville, South Carolina, and concludes with her hard work to start a school for African American students in Florida. Through the scenes we see the struggle that Mary encountered just to be given the chance to learn to read and then to teach others, including being threatened with bodily harm. The drama shows how she started with nothing and ended up being an advisor to a United States President!

Other Programs in the Series:

Program One - Grace and Rachel Martin

This is the story of two sisters-in-law living alone in the South Carolina back country who waylaid a British Courier with valuable papers by dressing up as colonial men. They risked their lives to stop the flow of information. Taped on location with historical costumes and artifacts, it takes place in the cabin considered to be the oldest frontier house still standing in SC.

Program Two – Emily Geiger

Emily is a young girl who risked her life by serving as a messenger for the Colonial army during the Revolutionary War. Captured by the British and interrogated as a spy, she managed to trick Lord Rawdon into believing she was innocent, outwitting her captors in a most unique manner. Taped in part at the actual location where the interrogation took place, this drama covers the story of Emily's journey from her assignment with General Greene to her release by Lord Rawdon.

Program Three - Mary Chesnut

Mary kept a diary during the turbulent times of the Civil War. This drama portrays various events in the life of the South Carolina heroine prior to and during the Civil War. The events dramatized are actual happenings that occurred to Mary and most of the words come straight from her diary. Mary actually spent time at Kensington Plantation, the location of the drama.

Program Four - The Grimké Sisters

Sarah Moore Grimké (1792-1873) and Angelina Emily Grimké (1805-1879), followed a similar path, speaking out about what they believed and leaving their home to join the fight for the causes of the abolition of slavery and equal rights for women. Today women are leaders in the community and in the business world, working along side their male counterparts in voicing and making their decisions, but it was not the same in the 1800's. These two South Carolina sisters helped lead the way to change the course of history in both our state and in the United States. We see from a young age how both stood up for what they believed were the wrongs of society. They spoke out against slavery and found the courage to fight for their right as women to have a voice.

NEW ITV Series – History of Women’s Achievement

This new series was added to the ITV schedule this year and has limited rights for ITV to broadcast, but is available online in *StreamlineSC*. Check with your DES personnel to see if they have it on tape if you need it that way. ITV will not be able to repeat this series until August or September 2009 due to our rights to broadcast, but you have access online anytime!

A History of Women’s Achievement in America celebrates women’s contributions to our history from the 17th century to present day by using archival photographs and footage to look at their inspiring accomplishments and victories. From Phyllis Wheatley to Maria Mitchell, from Susan B. Anthony to Nellie Bly, from Nancy Lopez to Oprah Winfrey – key women over a 400-year period are featured.

Carolina Stories – Two Programs Feature Special Women

- **Modjeska Monteith Simkins – Makin’ A Way Out of No Way**

Repeats March 4, 9:00–9:58 a.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited rights)

Modjeska Monteith Simkins (1899–1992) was one South Carolina’s great women. Entitled **Modjeska Monteith Simkins – Makin’ A Way Out of No Way**, this program paints an interesting profile of the civil rights matriarch and human rights activist and was produced by ETV’s Beryl Dakers. Born in Columbia, Modjeska graduated from Benedict College in 1921 and taught school before she was married in 1929. She had to quit her job because at that time SC schools could not employ married women, but she continued to work at different jobs to make a difference by representing the needs of the African-American community. In the 1940s and 1950s, she helped create over a hundred branches of the NAACP around our state. She believed that the best way to make change was to vote so she made sure people knew about their voting rights and participated in elections. For the rest of her life, she dedicated herself to the idea of civil rights and opportunity for all people.

- **This is Brookgreen Gardens**

Repeats March 4, 10:03–10:31 a.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited rights)

This ETV program that aired for the first time in February 2008 explores one of the state’s most beloved landmarks! A distinctive collection of American figurative sculpture, education programs, dazzling gardens, rare natural habitats, and a long and fascinating history make Brookgreen Gardens a unique treasure. The program highlights artist and philanthropist Anna Hyatt Huntington’s life and works, outlining the path that she and her equally famous husband took to create Brookgreen Gardens and populate the coastal plantation with art not only created by Mrs. Huntington, but by artists from throughout the world. Their home, the gardens and the sculpture are the focus of the program as we learn about the Huntington’s dream of sharing the art in this historic, natural setting and helping to develop the Murrell’s Inlet area of the low country by providing services and jobs for the residents.

Women’s History Month - Take a Look at **StreamlineSC**

StreamlineSC offers several programs and clips to highlight the impact women had on the progression of history. By searching the “Learning Tools” section of **StreamlineSC** the “Archived Teacher Feature” offers a unit on Women in History. Another “Learning Tools” resource is the “Calendar.” By clicking on the month of March and going to the commemorative section, “Women’s History Month” is featured.

Female Authors, Storytellers and Illustrators

Several programs in **Inside Writing** and **A Literary Tour of SC** series produced through ITV by Martha Alewine, SCDE Library Media Consultant, feature women and are good resources for “Women’s History Month.” **Inside Writing** highlights prominent authors who have visited our state. Each discusses how she gets her ideas for books and how she develops her storylines and characters. **A Literary Tour of SC** features authors who call our state their home. They each discuss their writing process, including how they do research and make characters come to life. These authors can inspire young writers!

Lessons in this series help students understand SC History and appreciate our state. The series uses dramatizations, visuals and historic photographs to explore our state’s history.
- **Susan Leigh Still, Part 1 & 2** – Programs 8 and 9 in **Conversations with Scientists and Astronauts**
Repeats March 4, 11:30 a.m.–12:05 p.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited rights)
These two programs feature NASA astronaut Susan Still discussing her education and training. She talks about teamwork, work ethic and fortitude.

Repeat - “Lady Edisons” of the 21st Century

Repeats March 4, 12:10–12:39 p.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited rights)

Fairfax Network presents **She’s Got It! Women and Their Inspirations**, which features women who appeared in the Smithsonian Institution’s Innovative Lives series. Designed for grades 4–8, this program allows students to explore the interdisciplinary world of invention, learn about the invention process, and meet the “Lady Edisons” of the 21st century. Included in this showcase of creative women are Ann Moore, the inventor of the Snugli Baby Carrier and Sally Fox, creator of FoxFibres. Students will meet young women who have won invention awards and prizes. This program aired for the first time in 2007.

Colonial Williamsburg Electronic Field Trip - March 26 Program Focuses on Early American Women!

The CWEFT programs use 21st century technology to enrich the teaching of history and social studies, making the subjects exciting and relevant to today's classrooms. The field trips are correlated to national standards and provide a dramatic and compelling learning experience for 4th and 5th grade students. Though schools may view the programs free and record them with 10-day fair use rights (can tape and use for 10 days from broadcast date, but must erase tape within 45 days), there are definite advantages to paying the fee to Colonial Williamsburg to participate.

By paying the fee to participate, schools get the outstanding teacher materials, get to keep the recorded program for the life of the tape and have access to the re-enactors and historians online and via a toll-free number. Schools pay approximately \$500 per school for all seven programs, but rights for individual programs can be purchased. Apr. 23, 2009 *Soldier of Liberty* – Enlist in the 2nd Virginia Regiment with young recruit Nathaniel Hutcheson and experience the everyday life of a soldier during the American Revolution. March into battle with Nathaniel as he encounters for the first time the noise, confusion and horror of war.

RIGHTS REMINDER: SC schools may view the programs with 10-day fair use rights. (Can record, but lesson must be used within ten days and then tape erased or destroyed within 45 days.) ONLY schools that receive a scholarship through ITV for one program OR schools that pay Colonial Williamsburg to participate either in single lessons or in the entire series can keep the copy of the program(s) for the life of the tape, receive the guides, get online access, and have phone interaction with the historians.

XPress: Character in Sports, Cyber Safety & Teen Health – Two Programs Feature Female Athletes, Great Role Models

Repeat block feed March 12, 10:15–11:14 a.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights)

XPress is a series of programs that ITV developed with ETV to allow teens to talk about important issues that affect them every day. The two **XPress: Character in Sports** programs feature two female athletes discussing character with a group of teenage girls. Celebrating Women's History Month with ITV... Idella Bodie's South Carolina Women Series produced by ITV with ETV features stories about heroines in our state's history. Each dramatization tells the story of women who have shaped South Carolina history and politics. From the Revolutionary War through modern times, the programs are a testament to the bravery and sacrifices of women who risked their own lives to help South Carolina. Recommended to support the South Carolina Social Studies Academic Standards in grades 3–8, the programs are suitable for grades 3–2 and are available

through our ITV broadcast schedule and etvStreamlineSC. Two **NEW** programs are being added to the schedule bringing us to present times. ***The Story of Dr. Wil Lou Gray*** tells the history of how the South Carolina Opportunity School began. The program follows Dr. Wil Lou Gray from the time she was a young girl struggling with the loss of her dear mother through her valiant efforts to get the Legislature to fund schooling for illiterate adults and children. Dr. Gray's passion for helping others learn is expressed through the interviews embedded in the dramatization. ***The Story of Mary McLeod Bethune*** is the story of one woman's struggle to gain equality for herself and others through education. The drama begins with Mary as a young girl growing up in Mayesville, South Carolina, and concludes with her hard work to start a school for African American students in Florida. The drama shows how she started with nothing and ended up as an advisor to a United States President. Other programs in the series include ***The Story of Grace and Rachel Martin***. Two sisters-in-laws living alone in the South Carolina backcountry while their husbands are away at war demonstrate their patriotism and bravery. ***The Story of Emily Geiger*** begins in June of 1781. Emily, a young girl from a wealthy farming family in Newberry County, wished that she were able to fight in the Revolutionary War like a man. History reveals that the young lady holding a laurel branch on the South Carolina State Seal is Emily Geiger. ***The Story of Mary Chesnut*** highlights the experiences of Mary Boykin Chesnut during the Civil War. Mary Boykin Chesnut's diary is valued as the most accurate picture of what really happened during the era of the Confederacy.

Concerned about student health and nutrition? ITV has many programming resources to instill the importance of good nutrition and health in your students. **For the teacher...School Health, Nutrition & Physical Activity Making It Happen!** is a wonderful resource for the teacher and health professionals. This series provides information on nutrition guidelines, obesity, wellness policies, resources, and successful programs in schools. These professional development programs can be accessed through the **ITV** Web site at <http://www.itv.myetv.org/> in **Educator+** and **StreamlineSC**. Take a look at a new series for elementary students, **Lucy's Tasty Treasures**. Developed by Dr. Katherine Cason, a Clemson University professor, this series seeks to improve nutrition and physical activity knowledge and behaviors of elementary students. The five program series addresses math, science, physical education, and health education standards through a storyline involving real kids who learn about healthy foods. **Deskercise** assists with the requirements for the SC Student Health and Fitness Act, which are available for viewing on **Educator+**. Designed for elementary students to exercise at their desks, this series consists of 185 interactive exercise episodes built around 37 weekly themes. Themes include National Nutrition Month, National Library Week and Earth Day. Available through **ITV** programming, there are five 10-minute lessons in each theme so educators can use one each day of the week. For the older student, **ITV's Exploring Healthy Choices** teaches students vital information concerning key areas of their health – maintaining a healthy weight, proper nutrition, portion control, getting enough sleep, understanding the dangers of drowsy driving, and suicide prevention. *Healthy choices become healthy habits for life!*

NEW to the ITV schedule, this program for grades Pre K–5th focuses on life skills using music and puppets. Topics include: **Jazz Music; Sickle Cell Awareness; Financial Literacy; and Emergency Preparedness.** The Auntie Karen Foundation partnered with ETV, Palmetto Health Children's Hospital and the USC School of Music to create this innovative pilot. Students are introduced to Auntie Karen characters: Olivia the Octopus, Bull and Bear and The Jamaican Yams. Auntie Karen, Inc. created the international characters and funding was provided by the SC Competitive Grants Program, Ronald McDonald House Charities and Auntie Karen Foundation www.auntiekaren.org.

Components of program:

What is Jazz?

This segment is designed to introduce the viewer to the concept of recognizing jazz music. Auntie Karen Character Olivia the Octopus and her friends teach the concept of recognizing jazz music by sharing what is not. Olivia the Octopus is an international jazz diva. She travels the world sharing a message of love through hugs and music.

When Cousin Zetta Comes to Visit - A Sickle Cell Story (The Jamaican Yams Story – already in SL)

This segment is designed to assist sickle cell patients, teachers, students and providers with tools to prevent a pain crisis, manage a mild pain crisis and provide age appropriate education about the signs of a pain crisis. Auntie Karen characters, The Jamaican Yams are used to teach this concept. Auntie Karen's The Jamaican Yams consists of: Yusef (Dad), Yolanda (Mom), Whipper (Son), Mya (Daughter), Gordon (Friend), and Cousin Zetta. Cousin Zetta has sickle cell disease.

Save or Spend?

This segment is designed to help the viewer understand the consequences of spending versus saving. Auntie Karen characters Bull and Bear are used to teach this concept. Bull & Bear consists of: Dblack the Bull, a corporate guy by day and a singer by night and Big Red the Bear, a blues singer.

There's A Hurricane Coming

This segment is designed to teach the viewer what is needed to prepare for an emergency. Auntie Karen characters, The Jamaican Yams, prepare an emergency preparedness kit in anticipation of the Hurricane. The Jamaican Yams consists of: Yusef (Dad), Yolanda (Mom), Whipper (Son), Mya (Daughter), Gordon (Friend), and Miles the dog.

Deskercise – National Nutrition Month Theme for March and April Themes to Plan Ahead Repeated This Month

Just for elementary students, this new ITV series designed for students to exercise right at their desks has theme-based programs for many special events, holidays and celebrations.
