EdAware: Eat Smart Move More

May 3, 4:30–4:57 p.m. ETV open circuit

Repeats May 6 and 13, 3:00–3:27 p.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited rights)

EdAware is a NEW educational series produced by ITV and ETV! The first group of **EdAware** programs is designed to **increase understanding of the problem of childhood obesity** and related health, nutrition and physical activity issues and to make viewers aware that they are part of the solution. ETV, the SC Department of Education, SC Department of Health and Environmental Control (DHEC), SC Institute for Childhood Obesity and Related Disorders, and the “Eat Smart Move More SC” Coalition have partnered to provide these important programs.

In this first program, entitled **EdAware: Eat Smart Move More**, Dr. Donald DiPette, Dean of the USC School of Medicine, gives a brief overview. Then Dr. James Stallworth, Pediatrics, USC School of Medicine and Director of SCICORD, along with Erika Kirby, Director of DHEC’s Division of Obesity Prevention and Control, talk more about the complexity of childhood obesity. In addition, the “Eat Smart Move More SC” key messages are presented along with information on what our communities and schools are doing to address this important issue.

The May 3rd broadcast is one of several **EdAware** programs on the topic of childhood obesity that will air on ETV in the next few months. ITV will repeat this program and two others that will be completed soon in the August or September schedule for schools to access. Watch for more information in the ITV New School Year Packet and September edition of the *ITV Update*.

Please share information about this program with your district/school administration, all teachers, school health professionals, and school community. The information is important for adults who care about the health of children.

Riverbanks Roundup – NEW Program May 17

Repeats May 20, 10:00–10:27 a.m. Channel 1 (Unlimited rights)

This NEW program on May 17th will focus on “Zoo Families!” From sea horses to flamingos and giraffes to baboons, zoo families are extraordinary. This program encourages understanding of unique parenting situations of aquatic animals, birds and mammals. Join host Katie Mixon and guest Sue Pfaff, Assistant Curator of Mammals, to learn how raising a wild family is tough, but animals can do it!

In addition, another new program will air on ETV June 14th at 6:30 p.m. This program is about the “Largest, Laziest and Loudest!” Which animals use these characteristics to their advantage? Students will see extreme characteristics and behaviors in zoo animals and learn how these often help animals survive. ITV will repeat all NEW **Riverbanks Roundup** programs that air on ETV during the summer when the ITV schedule returns in August.

IMPORTANT: Please help us determine how many copies of the *ITV Link* you need for your teachers, including special area teachers. The *ITV Link* is the educator’s guide to video-based resources and a copy is printed for each teacher. The purpose of this publication is to provide educators with information they need to identify and access resources available through ITV and ETV by broadcast and online in *StreamlineSC*.

Fax the form on page 27 by May 29 to let us know your updated count for 2009–10 or e-mail the information to Bonnie McMurray in ITV at mcmurray@scetv.org. It is important that we know how many copies you need so we make sure that we print enough to begin with and we send you the number you need for your teachers. Thank you for providing this information by May 29.

ALERT YOUR ADMINISTRATION AND CUSTODIAL STAFF: Copies of the 2009–10 *ITV Link* will be distributed to media specialists in early to mid August through your local DES personnel or sent directly to each school in marked boxes or large envelopes. It is important that you alert your administration and custodial staff that these packages will be coming. Please plan a place to put them when they are delivered to your school so they will be where you know they are when you return.

ITV New School Year Packet

A packet containing a “boat load” of new information about resources, registration materials for fall ITV recertification courses and flyers on new programming will be sent to each media specialist and DES by mid August. Important news from ITV and ETV will be included so please open immediately!

ITV Resources Book, Web Site, Monthly ITV Update

- ***ITV Resources book*** - The complete resources book lives on the Web! This is the same informational resource (but updated!) that you have used for years. It is still alive and well, but only accessed online. Please access this by the start of the new school year and remember that you are welcome to print hard copies from the Web as needed.
- ***ITV Web site*** - Individual lesson titles, exact duration lengths and schedules can be found on the ITV Web site www.itv.scetv.org. This site has the most current information. **NOTE:** ITV will use www.itv.scetv.org Web address next year, but the myetv.org address will still work!
- ***ITV Update*** – Programming additions, including the many teleconferences for students and teachers, will continue to be provided in the monthly *ITV Update* sent in hard copy to library media specialists, principals, district instructional leaders, and district superintendents. Many of the national offerings do not announce their schedule in time to be included in the *ITV Link* or online *ITV Resources* book. Therefore, they are announced monthly in the *ITV Update*, which is posted on the Web by the 25th of the preceding month. So, you don’t have to wait on it to arrive by “snail mail.” Check the ITV Web site at the end of the month, access the word version and e-mail key information to your teachers!

OnePlaceSC – ETV’s K–12 Educational Portal

ETV offers this new educational service to assist SC teachers! **OnePlaceSC** allows teachers to search all their quality educational content, including Knowitall.org, *StreamlineSC*, PBS Teachers and Kids, Annenberg, and Teachers Domain. In addition, it makes the State Department of Education’s ITV resources and State Library’s DISCUS content sites available.

Funded by the K–12 Technology Committee, **OnePlaceSC** also contains a TV guide feature displaying all of ETV’s satellite and broadcast LIVE programming, which can be streamed on-demand. This includes professional development programs. Teachers and staff may use their existing *StreamlineSC* username and password to explore all the educational tools in **OnePlaceSC**.

All Rendered Truth (A.R.T.)

Grades 5–12 1 lesson/57 minutes

Visual Arts/Culture

This program highlights the work of 21 artists working throughout the southeastern United States. Using a variety of media and demonstrating a range of creative approaches, these interesting individuals are self-taught artists, often referred to as visionary or folk artists. The program was developed by the Folk Artists Foundation, which has roots in our state.

Auntie Karen's Place

Grades Pre-K–5 2 lessons/10–27 minutes

Health/Life Skills

This series, which was created by the Auntie Karen Foundation partnership with ETV, Palmetto Children's Hospital and the USC School of Music, focuses on health and life skills using music and puppets to interest young learners. Topics include: sickle cell awareness, financial literacy and emergency preparedness.

The Big Picture

Grades 7–12 8 lessons/27 minutes

Social Studies

This series is produced by ETV and features timely topics of interest about our state. Selected programs that will be available through ITV include *The Catawba River*, *SC's Military History*, *South Carolina's First Ladies*, and *Drummond: The Senator from Ninety-Six*.

Career Day Series

Grades 5–8 3 lessons/30 minutes

Career Education

This series is designed to support efforts to increase student interest and performance in science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM). The programs spark student interest in STEM-related careers through virtual field trips into various days in the lives of experts and also provide information on the education students would need to pursue these careers.

Eat Smart Move More SC Shorts

Grades K–12 4 lessons/30 seconds

Health/Fitness

These short segments are recommended for use in school news programs. Developed by ITV and ETV, working with SCDE, DHEC, the USC School of Medicine, and the ESMMSC Coalition, these short segments promote the Eat Smart Move More messages in an effort to address childhood obesity by providing information on healthy eating habits and physical activity.

ETV Road Show Travels SC

Grades 3–12 12 lessons/Varied

Social Studies

This series is comprised of short segments from the ETV Road Show that were produced about history, places and things in our state. Topics include Historic Camden, Edgefield Pottery, Clemson's Calhoun Home, The Dock Street Theatre, and Horses in Aiken.

Eye on the Past

Grades 3–12 22 lessons/2–5 minutes

Social Studies

This series was produced by WRJA-TV in Sumter to provide short segments on interesting, significant historical people, places and events in our state's history. Segments include: *History of the Revolutionary War Battle at Hobkirk's Hill*, *Melrose Plantation: The Home of Matthew Singleton in the High Hills of Santee*, *Story of the Old Sumter Court House*, *History of the CSS Hunley Submarine*, and *Story of the Civil War Battle at Dingle's Mill*.

Flight School

Grades 4–8 **4 lessons/30 minutes** **Science**

This four-part series examines historical, scientific and technological aspects of aviation and its impact on exploration, communication and commerce. Each program integrates science, technology, engineering, physics, math, and other fields of study. Produced by the Fairfax Network.

Meet the Author

Grades K–12* **30 lessons/30 minutes** **Language Arts**

This series, produced by the Fairfax Network, promotes literacy and an interest in reading and writing. The programs each feature an award-winning author who discusses his or her work for children or teens (*each program is designed for a specific age group depending on the book discussed) and important components such as character, plot, the writing process, etc. Included in the series: Kalli Dakos, Stuart J. Murphy, Dan Gutman, Rosemary Wells, Christopher Paul Curtis, Sharon Creech, T.A. Barron, and Carmen Agra Deedy.

Music (Fairfax Network)

Grades 4–6 **2 lessons/30 minutes** **Music**

In these programs students learn about various aspects of music and hear discussions between artists and students on interesting topics from listening to the classical works of Mozart, Bach and Haydn to the electric guitar.

Mysteries and Perils of Migratory Birds

Grades 6–8 **3 lessons/30 minutes** **Science**

Highlighting many interesting and varied aspects of our state and its history, this series is provided by ETV. Titles added for 2009-10 include *Behind the Scenes...Restaging Martha Graham's Sketches from "Chronicle," Carolina Caught* and *Carolina A-Z*.

Earth Day Specials SL

Grades K–12 **1 new lesson/57 minutes** **Science/Social Studies**

This NEW program was produced as part of the **Project Discovery** series and focuses on the our South Carolina rivers, highlighting the area around the Columbia Canal and introducing a river keeper whose job it is to care for this important resource so it will be preserved for future generations to explore and enjoy. Rudy Mancke co hosts the program.

Grades 3–12 **new lessons TBA/11–57 minutes** **Varied**

These specials produced by ETV focus on South Carolina people and places. As programs that can be used by schools are produced, they will be added to this series.

Grades 5–12 **new lessons TBA/27 minutes** **Science/Social Studies**

This series is produced by Clemson University and explores intriguing facets of nature in order to provide science-based insights that promote environmental awareness and conservation practices. The scenic outdoor adventures take place all around South Carolina and in nearby states as well as some far away places, presenting informative explanations of environmental issues.

Idella Bodie's SC Women SL

Grades 3–8 **2 new lessons/22-25 minutes** **Social Studies**

Produced by ITV and ETV, two new programs about famous South Carolina heroines will be added to this series that features dramatizations, which tell the story of women who shaped SC history and politics. Program 5 - Wil Lou Gray tells the story of Dr. Wil Lou Gray who began the South Carolina Opportunity School. The program follows her from the time that she was a struggling young girl through her valiant effort to get the Legislature to fund schooling for illiterate adults and children. Through reenactment of scenes in her life and interviews taped with Dr. Gray by ETV in the 1980's, we find out about her passion to help others learn while we see what life was like during the early 1900's for many South Carolinians. Program 6 – Mary McLeod Bethune is the story of one woman's struggle to gain equality for herself and her students. The drama begins with Mary as a young child growing up in Mayesville, SC, and concludes with her hard work to start a school for African American students in Florida. Through the scenes we see the struggle that Mary encountered just to be given the chance to learn to read and then to teach others, including being threatened with bodily harm. The drama shows how she started with nothing and ended up being an advisor to a United States President!

A Literary Tour of South Carolina SL

Grades 5-12 **9 new lessons/27–56 minutes** **Language Arts**

In this series produced by ITV and ETV, students meet nationally recognized authors who call SC home such as Jack Bass, William Price Fox, Idella Bodie, Dorthea Benton Frank, Mary Alice Monroe, Sue Monk Kidd, and many others. As they learn about the writing process, students hear what the authors have to say about making characters come alive on the page, learn how they create the plot for their stories and keep track of the action, and find out how important research is to any story, both fiction and non-fiction.

Riverbanks Roundup SL

Grades K-5 **9 new lessons/27 minutes** **Science/Social Studies**

Produced by ITV, ETV and the Riverbanks Zoo and Gardens, this series features educational aspects of the many wonderful animals, flora and fauna at the zoo! Go behind the scenes to learn about the characteristics of animals and their habitats with zoo professionals who care for all the different creatures both large and small.

Series Deleted from ITV Schedule - Important

Schools and districts **MUST ERASE OR DESTROY** tapes/DVDs for the deleted/removed series unless retention rights are arranged with distributor. (See **RETENTION RIGHTS** information below.)

Series that will be removed from the ITV schedule for 2009–10 are announced on page 5. Look for more details in the 2009–10 *ITV Link*, the online *ITV Resources* book and in the ITV New School Year Packet.

***For a list of all series deleted over the last 16 years, check the ITV Web site under Program Information as “Previously Deleted ITV Programs.”**

Several series were no longer available for distribution. Others are being removed because they are older resources. And, some have been deleted this year due to increased costs to access.

RETENTION RIGHTS: If your school or district is interested in retaining the tapes, you will need to contact the distributor at the number that will be provided to find out the availability of retention rights (keeping your tapes for the life of the tape and paying a yearly fee to the distributor). Usually retention rights cost about \$1.00 per minute paid on a yearly basis.

School Health Success Stories – NEW ITV PD Series

Block feed May 6, 9:00 a.m.–12:18 p.m. Channel 2

Repeat block feed May 13, 9:00 a.m.–12:18 p.m. Channel 2 (Unlimited rights)

Schools in South Carolina are working to improve health and academic outcomes of the state's school-aged youth. Nine programs featuring South Carolina districts, schools and their community partners implementing best practices, programs and policies that support school health are featured in the **School Health Success Stories** series. ITV and ETV produced this NEW series.

SC Healthy Schools, a partnership between the South Carolina Department of Education and South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control, showcases how schools are increasing physical activity and improving nutrition among elementary school students, and decreasing sexual risk behaviors among middle and high school students. A successful district-wide school employee wellness program is also highlighted.

This professional development series is designed for district and school administrators, teachers, school nurses, guidance counselors, school health/wellness committee members, parents, community partners, and others interested in improving student health and academic achievement.

Nevitt Forest Elementary, Anderson School District Five (duration 14:23)

In an effort to improve student nutrition, Nevitt Forest Elementary School in Anderson, SC partners with Palmetto Agriculture Consultants, the Anderson County Farmers Market, Clemson University, and local farmers. This segment highlights the "Grow With Me" program, which includes the use of school gardens and integration of fresh fruits and vegetables and nutrition education throughout the academic curriculum.

Kelly Miller Elementary, School District of Fairfield County (duration 12:56)

This segment highlights the adoption of CATCH (Coordinated Approach To Child Health), a proven effective program that teaches students the importance of nutrition and physical activity, at Kelly Miller Elementary School in Winnsboro, SC. Working together to address childhood obesity in Fairfield County, school staff and community partners discuss the implementation of CATCH and school activities, such as Favorite Fruit Friday.

Manning Primary School, Clarendon School District Two (duration 14:39)

Learn more about the planning, building and use of a 12-station fitness trail at Manning Primary School in Manning, SC. Built by Manning High School students, the fitness trail is used by Manning Primary School teachers to incorporate physical activity into academic lessons and provides an opportunity for physical activity for the community.

Richland School District 2 (duration 12:21)

Superintendent Stephen Hefner and district staff discuss the development and success of Commit to 2B Fit, a district-wide school employee wellness program. Nearly 800 district employees participated in the program and made the commitment to be healthy and fit.

R.B. Stall High School, Charleston County School District (duration 15:46)

In an effort to reduce sexual risk behaviors among students, R.B. Stall High School in North Charleston, SC and the Charleston Trident Urban League partner to implement Safer Choices, a research-based, proven effective sexuality education curriculum. School staff and community partners discuss the benefits of the curriculum and the Peer Leadership Team and Family Resource Center.

Drayton Hall Elementary School, Charleston County School District (duration 17:17)

In an effort to improve student health, Drayton Hall Elementary School in North Charleston, SC has adopted a variety of school health programs and practices. This segment features activities such as the Healthy Bobcat Club, Walk to School Day, Jump Rope Club, Running Club, Basketball Club, incorporation of physical activity into the classroom, and daily walks after lunch.

Wren Elementary School, Anderson School District One (duration 7:44)

This segment focuses on how teachers at Wren Elementary School in Piedmont, SC are integrating physical education and South Carolina history with "Pedaling Across the Palmetto State" activities. Students track their biking miles to locations across the Palmetto State and then receive a history lesson in the classroom about where they "ride."

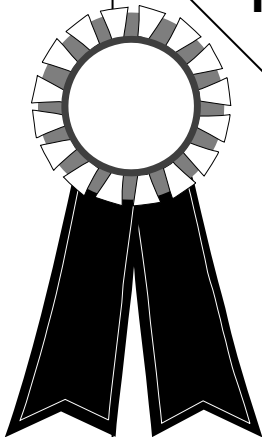
Bamberg School District Two (duration 10:04)

Bamberg School District Two is proud of the success and national recognition they have received with Teen Life Center and implementation of comprehensive sexuality education at Denmark-Olar High School and Denmark-Olar Middle School. This segment focuses on the partnership between the schools and the Teen Life Center and their efforts to decrease sexual risk behaviors among students.

Jennie Moore Elementary School, Charleston County School District (duration 19:20)

Curriculum and Content Corner... getting ready for college, summer jobs and summer vacation... with Dianne L. Gregory

Our thoughts turn to the future in the month of May to summer jobs, summer vacation and college. **ITV** resources can assist in preparing your students for the excitement of this time of year. College preparation...the program and information guide for **Finding Money for College** is available to parents and students through **Career Aisle** on knowitall.org as well as our **ITV** web site <http://www.itv.scetv.org/>. Guidance counselors and teachers can also locate the program on *StreamlineSC*. Aid categories, tips for parents and students and scholarship and grant resources are available from this site. **Your College Experience: Strategies for Success** is a series designed for use with students that are looking ahead to college. Keys to success, time management, learning styles, listening and learning in the classroom, making the grade, major and career planning are just a few topics covered in this "ITV By Request" program. Information for this program can be found in the **ITV Resource Book** p. 101. For students advancing to the next level, **Becoming Successful in Middle School** can be found in *StreamlineSC* and our **ITV** schedule. This is an excellent series to encourage successful strategies in school.

Preparations for employment can be a daunting task for students. **Careers for the 21st Century** explores a variety of careers and skills required for the task. **The World of Work Series** also available on *StreamlineSC* helps students and entry-level employees understand the attitudes and work habits needed for success on the job. Viewers learn the importance of being a team player on the job, see why every job is important and discover why it is important to ask questions and follow company rules and procedures. Understanding the importance of getting along with co-workers and employers is another aspect of this series. The program examines safety on the job and diversity in the workplace. Other key factors of this series emphasize the importance of behaving responsibly on the job and the possibility of serious legal problems related to substance abuse. Searching for "career and workplace skills" on *StreamlineSC* will give you access to 1,603 resources on the topic. Many programs can be viewed in Spanish and English; additionally, teacher guides can be retrieved from the site. **School to Work: Essential Skills and Workplace Basics**, a Sunburst series, provides students with information concerning interpersonal skills, thinking skills and technology skills that are an important part of every work place.

As summer arrives, safety and first aid skills are critical for the elementary/middle school student when many students have care-giving responsibilities for others. **Safety and First Aid**, available on *StreamlineSC*, provides a valuable resource and facilitator's guide to skills such as first aid practices for cuts and scrapes, step by step procedures for assisting a choking victim and home safety practices. Safety resources provided by **ITV** for older students as they navigate through life's tough choices include **Talking It Over: Teen Issues** and **Teen Survival Programs**. These programs provide an insight into the harsh reality of risk taking behaviors and consequences. **Safe Student School Scenarios**, produced by **ETV/ITV** and available through **ITV** and *StreamlineSC* provides ten short dramatizations of serious issues facing students today. Teachers are advised to preview these lessons as with all of our resources. Additional resources for young students include **Safety City**, **Primary Health and Safety Series**, **Bicycle Safety: Zone of Danger**, **Playground Safety**, and **Me Only Me**. There are also many programs on healthy eating habits as we look ahead to good nutritional habits for summer. **Nutrition: Eat and Be Healthy** for older students and **Taking Charge in Meadowland** for younger students are good programs to get our summer nutritional habits off to a good start. For 2009–10, the series will have this new title, but it will be the same lessons that aired previously. **Space Files** provides a comprehensive review of space and astronomy. The inner and outer solar system, earth space and the cosmos are covered in the 26 lessons that are each 10 minutes in duration and designed for grades 5–12. National Space Day is always the first Thursday in May so this year **Space Day is May 7th**...access these to use!

Though schools may view FREE and record programs with 10-day fair use rights (can tape and use for 10 days from broadcast date, but must erase tape within 45 days), there are advantages to paying the fee to Colonial Williamsburg to participate. By paying the fee, schools get teacher materials, get to keep the recorded program for the life of the tape and have access to the re-enactors/historians online and via a toll-free number. 2009–10 Schedule:

- Oct. 15, 2009 ***Emissaries of Peace*** – During the turbulent era of the French and Indian War, the Cherokee people struggled to preserve their independence. Follow Cherokee leader Ostenaco and Virginian Henry Timberlake on their 1762 journey from Chota (the capital of the Cherokee nation) to Williamsburg and London in search of a lasting peace.
- Nov. 19, 2009 ***A More Perfect Union (premiere)*** – Witness the conflict and compromise that accompanied the ratification of the U.S. Constitution. Join young eighteenth-century observers, unseen by convention delegates, as they travel from state to state tallying the vote. Learn about the ratification process and Americans' growing interest in their fledgling nation's new government.
- Dec. 10, 2009 ***Jamestown Unearthed*** – Take a look at how history is written and reevaluated as new methods of study are introduced. Using the example of Jamestown in 1607, explore the myths and misconceptions of that era: revisit the documents, artifacts and other evidence through archaeology. Learn how every generation sees the evidence in new ways, and how this affects our understanding of the past.
- Jan. 14, 2010 ***Westward! (premiere)*** – Explore the story of the early days of American westward expansion. Daniel Boone recounts the exciting experiences and unexpected consequences associated with moving west. Learn about the risks and grueling personal hardships of creating new settlements.
- Feb. 11, 2010 ***The Slave Trade*** – Beginning with the American Revolution, this program explores the U.S. law of 1807 that abolished the trans-Atlantic slave trade. Meet the people who were involved in or influenced by this pivotal legislation: the slaves, plantation owners, slave-ship captains, common seamen, government officials, Navy officers, and anti-slavery activists.
- Mar. 11, 2010 ***The Rights of Youth (premiere)*** – Imprisonment, whipping, forced transportation, and even death were some of the punishments that courts sentenced children to in the eighteenth century. Witness how justice was administered at a time when criminal laws and sentencing guidelines made few or no exceptions for children.
- Apr. 22, 2010 ***Treasure Keepers*** – You have seen their work in every museum, but what do conservators really do? Learn how conservators prevent or slow the damage caused by "agents of destruction." Explore how and why preserving history is important for future generations.

***RIGHTS: SC schools may view with 10-day fair use rights. (Can record, but lesson must be used within ten days and erased/destroyed within 45 days.) MonarchLIVE Series from PWN (Prince William Network)

Repeat block feed of first three programs May 12, 9:00 a.m.–12:06 p.m. Channel 2

**NEW programs are planned to air May 19 and 21, 12 noon–1:00 p.m. Channel 2
and May 28, 12 noon–12:30 p.m. Channel 2 (All with unlimited rights)

This series of teleconferences follows the magical migration of monarchs. Designed for grades 4–8, the six programs provide a visit with Mexican and American biologists who study the monarch's winter habitat. Every year millions of monarchs migrate thousands of miles from Canada and the United States to over winter in the mountain peaks in Mexico. The magical journey is dependent on conservation of habitats in three North American countries – United States, Canada and Mexico.

The first program in the series, **MonarchLIVE – Kickoff**, aired October 2008. **MonarchLIVE – In the Mexican Mountains** aired February 17 and focused on the biology of over wintering monarchs in the oyamel forests, finding and reporting tagged monarchs and conservation work in Mexico. The third program entitled **MonarchLIVE – Community Conservation in Mexico** followed on February 19. It showed how the community where the monarchs over winter are involved in monitoring and conservation work. Wintering behavior, resting, avoiding predators, and reserving lipids for northward migration are reviewed.

The final three programs in the series are supposed to air this month: May 19 **MonarchLIVE – Little Spaces; Big Results, May 21 **MonarchLIVE – Building a Population** and May 28 **MonarchLIVE – Monarchs in Canada**. However, due to funding, they may only be available by webcast from PWN (Prince William Network). ITV will post information in the NEWSFLASH section and send announcement once we know status of broadcast. The webcast will be available from the homepage at <http://monarch.pwnet.org> beginning at noon each day. During the programs, students can e-mail or call in questions.

These will focus on how small spaces can have big results for the butterflies, how the population grows and is monitored and the northern range where monarchs are a protected species. Please access these programs for your middle-grade teachers as these will enhance their science curriculum!

Career Day Series Repeats

Outlines the responsibilities of instructional leaders to principals who are new to the KITE-LL program. The focus is on the conditions necessary for the successful implementation of the KITE-LL program.

A Gendered Classroom

A new ITV recertification course entitled *A Gendered Classroom* and developed by instructor David Chadwell provides key information about single-gender education.
